

The Sacrament of Baptism is ordinarily celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at 12:00 pm. To schedule Baptism, please call the Parish Office, at least one month in advance.

Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Godparent/Sponsor Catholic for **Baptism** Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

Homily Reflection Books

Homily Reflections: Each student must write 14 Homily Reflections as follows: A minimum of 9 Masses throughout the year as well as 3 Mandatory Masses together with Christmas and Easter Masses. (*Minimum Total of 14 Homily Reflections.*) This is not saying you only have to attend Mass 14 times a year. Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.



The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process by which adults who would like to become Catholic, or Catholic adults who would like to receive all of their Sacraments are able to do so. 

Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

During a bad storm, Jesus ordered the wind and sea to be still, and his disciples were quite amazed at his power. Jesus reminds them to trust and have faith, even in times of danger.

"A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Quiet! Be still!' The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, 'Why are you so terrified? Do you not have faith?' They were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who is this whom even the wind and sea obey?'"

Saint Mark paints a beautiful picture of a crisis and opportunity for Jesus to respond. He does care that we are perishing when we walk away from Him. He is not asleep, but waiting for us to turn to Him. Some might take the scene and say this is the stormy world we are living in. Jesus do you not care? Others might think that the crisis in the church today fits the same description. Sexual abuse, scandal, criticism certainly do not make the picture appealing.

Jesus does care. Do I do my part to still the wind and calm the sea of discontent? He asks me, why I care, why I am terrified or if my faith provides the direction the Spirit of God is leading us. I need to awaken. The Chinese use two picture characters to describe a crisis – danger and opportunity. May we calmly take advantage of the teaching and opportunity.


Gift Auction
