

The Sacrament of Baptism is ordinarily celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at 12:00 pm. To schedule Baptism, please call the Parish Office, at least one month in advance.

Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for **Baptism** Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

Altar Rosary Society



Our Family Faith Formation Full Year Program

supports each parent/guardian/grandparent's vocation as the first and best teacher of their children in the ways of faith *in a very intentional way* and provides resources for parents to work with their children at home. Please contact the Religious Ed Dept. for more information.

- A family commitment to work on the home lessons with their children.
- Attendance at all parent/student monthly sessions (7 Sessions September-March) as there are no makeup sessions.

- 14 Homily Reflections with raised seal.

Homily Reflection Books

Homily Reflections: Each student must write 14 Homily Reflections as follows: A minimum of 9 Masses throughout the year as well as 3 Mandatory Masses together with Christmas and Easter Masses. (*Minimum Total of 14 Homily Reflections.*) This is not saying you only have to attend Mass 14 times a year. Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.



The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process by which adults who would like to become Catholic, or Catholic adults who would like to receive all of their Sacraments are able to do so. Gospel: John 6:24-35

The people Jesus had fed on five loaves of bread follow him, and Jesus tells them they should not be looking for perishable food, but for spiritual food. The people want a sign that they should believe in him. He explains that he is the bread of life, and anyone who believes will not experience hunger or thirst. The people did not fully understand that he was speaking in the spiritual sense, and not of actual food.

"Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. So they said to him 'What can we do to accomplish the works of God?' Jesus answered and said to them, 'this is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent.'... 'So Moses said 'this is the bread God has given you to eat.'"

Remembering that John's gospel does not report the last supper, his sixth chapter teaches us about the Eucharist. We are engaged in a 'Eucharistic Revival' with our eyes fixed on a national gathering, a Eucharistic Congress.

In our time greater emphasis has been given to Eucharistic adoration, reminding us that the Eucharist is not a thing, but a Person. Before liturgy, or following mass, spend a few minutes acknowledging your belief that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharistic, and seeks our faith in His Real Presence. In this way we can 'accomplish the works of God.'



EASY TO MAKE FRESH PIZZA DOUGH

Makes one 12" pie • Preheat oven to 400°

Ingredients

Dough: 6 oz. warm water • 1 tbsp. sugar • $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp. dry yeast • $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt 1 tbsp. olive or cooking oil • $2 \frac{1}{2}$ cups flour

Toppings: Your choice, tomato sauce or fresh sliced tomatoes spread over dough. 8 oz. mozzarella or your favorite cheese. *Optional - meat, vegetables, spices.*

Directions

In a mixing bowl add water, sugar and yeast. Stir, let sit 15 minutes to activate yeast. Add oil, salt and flour, mixing well (if needed add a few drops of water). Knead 8-10 minutes on a floured surface. Put floured dough ball in a bowl and cover to rise, about 1 hour. Roll dough on floured surface into a 12" circle and put on baking sheet. Top with your favorites and bake for 10-12 minutes or until done.

Note: Flour, bread crumbs or cornmeal on pan help prevent pizza from sticking.
