Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is ordinarily celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at 12:00 pm. To schedule Baptism, please call the Parish Office, at least one month in advance.

Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

A journey in faith

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

is a process where you can experience the Catholic faith community. It is an opportunity for questions to be answered and for learning about the teachings and traditions of the Catholic Church. **Are you:**

- A person who has not been baptized and would like to learn more about the Catholic faith, and become a Catholic
- A Baptized Christian of another denomination who would like to learn about and join the Catholic tradition?
- A baptized Roman Catholic who has not received Eucharist or Confirmation and would like to become a full participant in the life of the Church?

The Christian Initiation process offers an environment of support and guidance as you discover God is working in your life. Through RCIA, the Epiphany parish community can help you fulfill this faith journey. *If you think the RCIA program is for you, and you would like registration information, please call Kelly in the Religious Ed office. **Classes begin this fall.***

Religious Education Students:

Homily Reflection Books

Homily Reflections: Each student must write 14 Homily Reflections as follows: A minimum of 9 Masses throughout the year as well as 3 Mandatory Masses together with Christmas and Easter Masses. (*Minimum Total of 14 Homily Reflections.*) This is not saying you only have to attend Mass 14 times a year. Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.

Hope in God

Gospel: Mark 10:2-16

The people began to ask Jesus if it was acceptable for a man to divorce his wife. Jesus tells them that two people who have been joined together by God should not be separated. People began bringing their children to Jesus, but the disciples tried to send them away. Jesus grew angry and told his disciples to allow the children to come to him.

"But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, no human being must separate."

The question posed, Mark tells us, was offered to 'test Jesus.' He responded clearly and explicitly referring to the Old Testament teaching of Moses. Have we read and reflected? Testing continues today, as we have distanced ourselves from the word of God and His teaching, with legalization of same sex unions, gender transformation. Where are committed Christians who accept such societal change, as all right. We assume we must stop for a red light. We know we are obliged to pay taxes. We should not remain silent when immoral legislation to accommodate the wishes of a particular group are catered to.

What others now call marriage is quite distinct from we who profess our faith in 'holy matrimony', a sacred sacrament of the Catholic church, a gift instituted by Jesus Christ. May the word of God today be the nudge to renew our marriage vows and have our marriage blessed in the church. The Lord is waiting for you.

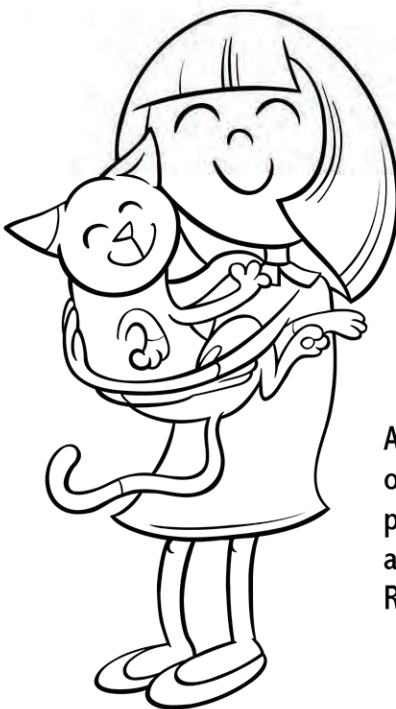
