Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is ordinarily celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at 12:00 pm. To schedule Baptism, please call the Parish Office, at least one month in advance.

Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for **Baptism** Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

Eucharistic Adoration: Every Wed. 3-6PM What is Eucharistic Adoration?

It is where you can be in the Presence of God in a real way. Jesus Christ Himself is present, on the altar, in a consecrated Host that is in the monstrance. "To visit the Blessed Sacrament is...proof of gratitude, an expression of love toward Christ our Lord" (CCC1418). It's where Jesus is waiting...for you to come to Him...

It takes some time to adjust to the silence & can even seem boring if you've never gone before. That's normal but if you can just breathe & relax, Jesus can teach you how to come to Him as a little child. Children find a sense of awe & wonder at things the rest of the world takes for granted or doesn't slow down to enjoy.

Re-discover Jesus! He's right here. In Adoration, God is present! Come talk to Him. He's waiting to listen to you, to help you & to pour out His graces upon you. He knows you. He loves you & He wants to bless you! "Behold the Lamb of God".

Gospel: Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

Jesus warns his followers to be prepared for the end of the world. He reminds them not to be preoccupied with unimportant events, or they will be caught unaware rather than being on watch as they should.

"May the Lord increase you and make you overflow with love for one another and for all, even as our love does for you. May he strengthen your hearts, making them blameless and holy before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones.... you must learn to make still greater progress..."

A new month, and a new time of prayer in the church. The message of Paul above was not directed only to the Thessalonians, but to me as I pray over these biblical verses. Advent is our time of anticipation and hope. As we live these days, I prayerfully ask what are my hopes and desires so that I can respond to God's call and make progress through His coming and grace.

Parish Pastoral Council

What is the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC)?

The PPC is an advisory group that assists the pastor in matters important to the life of the parish (except financial). The members of the PPC's main role is to pray, reflect and make recommendations to the pastor on various parish concerns. The members are not a decision - making council.

What are some parish concerns the PPC might be called upon to assist with?

The PPC may be tasked with pastoral planning, reviewing programs we may wish to adopt at the parish, evaluating our outreach and evangelization efforts, and similar concerns.

What should the makeup of the PPC be?

The members of the PPC should reflect the makeup of the parish. Ideally, members are willing to be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit as the PPC prayerfully considers items brought before it. Members should have the best interests of the parish at heart. Members should also be able to constructively add to the discussions taking place at the PPC meetings.

Currently, the PPC should consist of 6 members who are appointed based on parish recommendations. There is also the possibility of a youth member as well as at-large members. At-large members will be appointed by the pastor and will typically be people who have served that parish well for a number of years and whose contributions are respected and would be missed if no longer available to the parish. Parish trustees are also de facto members of the PPC.

How often does the PPC meet?

The PPC meets on the second Tuesday of each month. (Occasionally this may be adjusted due to holidays.)

How long is a term of service for a PPC member?

A term of service for the PPC is 3 years. Currently, we are reforming the PPC. WE will have 6 new members of the PPC: two will serve full terms of 3 years, two will serve for 2 years, and two will serve for just 1 year. Moving forward, each year there will be two new members appointed to 3-year terms.

Who should be considered for membership on the PPC?

It should go without saying that to be a member of the PPC a person should also be a member of the parish itself. Ideally the person should be a parishioner for awhile to get to know the parish itself. They should be someone involved in the life of the parish in some way. PPC members should be willing to be committed to the work of the PPC. (Parish staff are not eligible to be members of the PPC.)

If you are interested in joining the PPC, please submit your name for consideration in the mailbox in the commons area, or please nominate someone you think would be beneficial to this ministry.




