Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is ordinarily celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at 12:00 pm. To schedule Baptism, please call the Parish Office, at least one month in advance.

Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for **Baptism** Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

HOPE For the Homebound Ministry





Online Giving

If you prefer to pay bills and manage your finances online, you can set up an account and make your parish offering online via our website. Homily Reflections: Each student must write 14 Homily Reflections as follows: A minimum of 9 Masses throughout the year as well as 3 Mandatory Masses together with Christmas and Easter Masses. (Minimum Total of 14 Homily Reflections.) This is not saying you only have to attend Mass 14 times a year. Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.


Celiac Sprue Parishioners

Contemporary Tenebrae Service Hope in the Shadows

Enhance your Lenten season by joining us here at Epiphany, on **Tuesday, April 15th at 7PM** for this special Tenebrae service. Hope in the Shadows recalls Christ's journey to the cross by examining the shadows of betrayal, injustice and agony that marked the journey. It contrasts the selfish exploits of humanity with the diving nature of loving God. As you take this sacred journey, may the words of James be a reminder of the hope which is ours:

Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights who does not change like shifting shadows. (James 1:17)





Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

The Pharisees grew disgusted with Jesus because of his compassion toward sinners. So, Jesus told them a story of a son who squandered his inheritance. When a famine broke out, he returned home and asked his father to become a hired hand. His father instead welcomed him with a joyful celebration, just as God is overjoyed when a sinner returns to him.

"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old order has passed away; now all is new. All this has been done by God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and has given us the ministry of reconciliation... he has entrusted the message of reconciliation to us... We implore you in Christ's name: be reconciled to God."

Our Lent is half over. Paul teaches us what God has done. Now it's our turn. I can take a step to forge forgiveness of others. Ask God's help to do so. But now is the time to be sure that Lent means something in 2025. See that the Sacrament of Reconciliation allows us to be one with Him. Use it as His expression of love for you today. As we approach Holy Week soon we are not just to remember Jesus' saving work, but respond. Make a good confession, He is still waiting. Be aware that He will one day ask us to make an accounting of our lives. Prepare your resume now.


