## Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

That's normal but if you can just breathe & relax, Jesus can teach you how to come to Him as a little child. 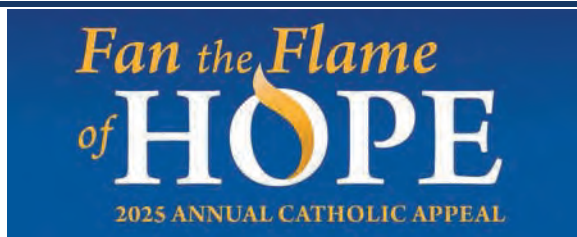

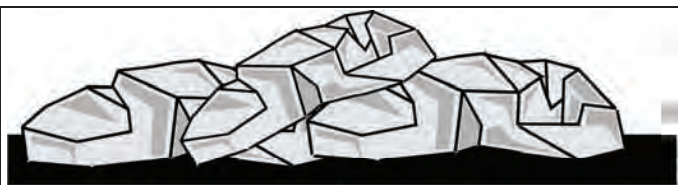

*Cast the first stone,  
if you are without sin!*

**Gospel: John 8:1-11**

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future.

"I consider everything as a loss, because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him...depending on faith to know him and the power of his resurrection, and sharing in his sufferings by being conformed to his death. I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it."

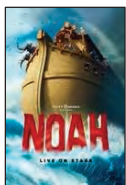

Surely not as well as He knows me. I might think I can say many things about Him and His forthcoming passion, but do I really know Him? His passion and death reveal how far He would go to save me.

May my prayer this week be to take a few minutes, ask His help to know Him as my savior and redeemer, based on an often-overlooked fact, that I am in need of Him right now. Jesus I want to know you better.

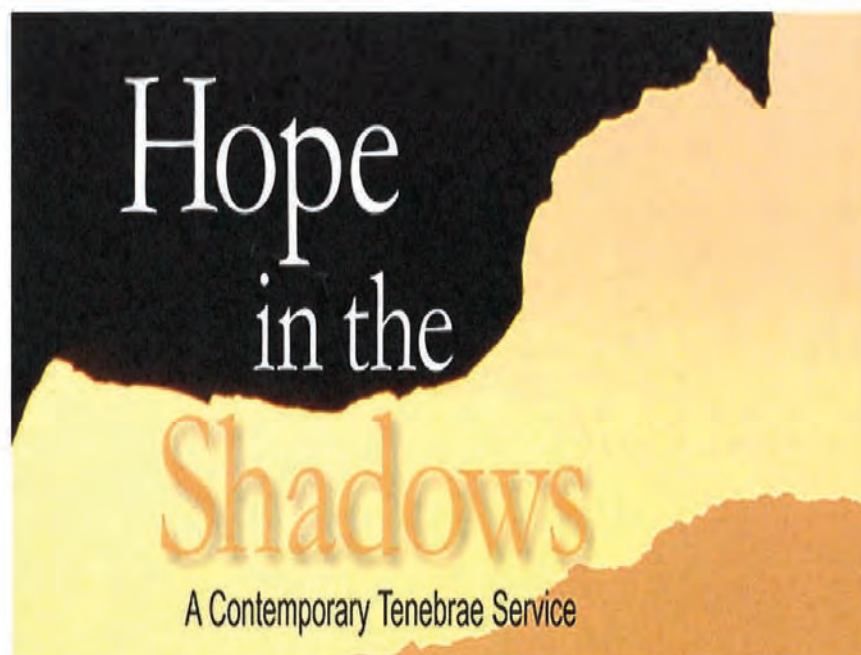
